Presentation Sunday & Examination

The format for this event will be based on the size of the class. There will still be a Presentation Sunday, but it will probably be abbreviated in format if our class is small.

The single most important question for each young person to be prepared to answer is: "Are you prepared to take responsibility for your own faith?"

Safe Space

Because of the complexity of faith development, and the need to encounter, explore, embrace, and perhaps discard a wide variety of faith stances related to some often controversial subjects, all class sessions will operate on a "Safe Space" concept.

This means that no matter what questions or opinions you or your child brings to the Confirmation class setting you will be treated with courtesy and respect, and invited to explore further what your understanding means.

Because faith issues are of such importance to the development of faith, it is expected that this same courtesy will be extended by you and your child as both they and others encounter new and sometimes uncomfortable understandings of faith issues.

It is in the searching that we discover the context, the purpose and the meaning of our Biblical texts.

Three Questions!

The three most important questions to ask when we explore scripture is:

- 1) What does it say?
- 2) What does it mean?
- 3) What does it mean to me?

The Blue Book

The traditional Evangelical Cathechism Book (often referred to as the Blue Book) is no longer in print.

It is however in the public domain (no copyright issues are involved in duplicating the book) and is available on the www.ucc.org web-site.

The church office has prepared a printed version which will be made available to you and the young people.

Be aware that it's language is not gender-inclusive.
